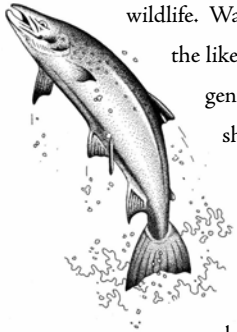
## The Local Area

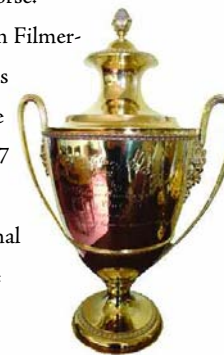
## Staying with us

Ruddyglow Park is ideally suited as a base for exploring the North West Coast. We are only 6 miles from Lochinver, less than 40 miles from Ullapool, and places like Drumbeg, Kylesku, Handa Island, Durness, Cape Wrath and the far north are all within an easy drive. The house is owned and run by Patricia Filmer-Sankey, a native of the parish of Assynt. Attention to detail, guest's wishes, their comfort and their enjoyment, are the main ingredients that the house runs on.

The breath taking views of Loch Assynt, the wild mountains opposite, and the many peaks of Quinag to the rear, all add to the magic of Ruddyglow Park.



We get many questions about our name. Where did "Ruddyglow" come from? The answer is simple; from a horse. Patricia's father, the late Captain Filmer-Sankey, had one great love in his early years; riding. His favourite horse, "Ruddyglow" won over 27 races and the Grand Military Gold cup three times. An original oil painting by an artist of the times still hangs in the dining room depicting the last Military Gold Cup.
